NIGC to Offer Game Machine Training in California

Washington, DC January 20, 2011 — The National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC) is offering "Regulating Gaming Technology" training on February 8-10, 2011, at the Thunder Valley Casino Resort, Lincoln, California.

This comprehensive 3-day training will assist tribal leaders, tribal gaming regulatory authorities and casino compliance personnel in understanding basic gaming technologies needed to effectively regulate technology on the casino floor.
